- Transco bus strike: BHS has nine buses with Transco. Mr. Besner received
 questions via email as to why the same routes are always affected, why can
 not the school board take the route from another company and share the
 pain with others?

Mr. Besner shared with the GB that companies bid for route and it is not possible for BHS transport to take over three routes from Transco or switch routes around. He noted that parents received a letter from the School Board regarding reimbursements, that is, \$7 per day for students and if parents owe the School Board money this will be deducted from the reimbursement parent would have received.

Mrs. Wilson asked if this included school fees? Mr. Besner said yes, funding would be used to pay school fees if child(ren) fees were outstanding.

2.6 Home and School

• Mrs. Wilson noted that a meeting was being planned and the committee is working on teachers' staff appreciation week. Parent workshop is coming up soon.

4.1 Principal Criteria Consultation

- Ian asked if this was a yearly exercise? Rachel said this is an exercise that has to be done every year.
- The Commissioner said that there is a recommendation that no more than one member of the administrative team be changed in a school year. Almost every meeting, there are administrative staff changes. Several administrators have gone back to teaching, many administrators retiring and the school board are having a tough time to get retirees to come back. This is an issue at every school.
- Vince stated that the letter will be deferred to the next meeting (February) after which it will be formulated and submitted by March 15th.

4.2 The BHS Budget

• The \$850,362.00 BHS allocation is based on government subventions. Last year was underbudget. The board keeps all but 15%. Total surplus 15%/ deficit = \$4,679.00.

4.3 The Lester B Pearson School Board Budget Consultation:

- The Chairman said the response is due by March 28. He asked the principal
 what his role is concerning the budget. The principal suggested that everyone
 look at it this month then peruse the past ones. She noted that the board has
 a clear indication of what they want to spend their money on. If there is

- The Chairperson stated it will be tabled for next month's meeting.
