Official Communications	
Interim Report	On October 14 th , 2016 you will receive an Interim Report which will include comments on your child's learning and behavior.
Term 1 Report Card	The Term 1 Report Card will be issued on November 18 th . This report card will cover the period from August 31 st , 2016 to November 4 th , 2016 and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 2 Report Card	The Term 2 Report Card will be issued on February 17 th , 2017. This report card will cover the period from November 7 th , 2016 to February 3 rd , 2017, and will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 3 Report Card	The Term 3 Report Card will be issued on June 28 th , 2017. It will cover the period from February 6 th , 2017 to the end of the year and will count for 60% of the final mark for the year. In some subjects, a final exam/evaluation covering the year's learning is administered and weighted at 20% of the third term mark.
